

Former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works Site News from the Corps

Hello from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District,

We are pleased to announce that the project to mitigate public safety hazards at the former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works Site Wastewater Treatment Plant, owned by the Town of Lewiston, is complete.

This work was completed using funds requested by Congresswoman Louise Slaughter and the Town of Lewiston and provided by the U.S. Office of Economic Adjustment. Work performed by the Corps on this project included: demolition of deteriorated structures (including the Acid Neutralization Building canopy, Pump House, and Venturi Vault), steel railings, and wooden tanks, and disposing of demolition debris. In partnership with the Corps' work, the Town of Lewiston secured the site by installing fencing and grates over open pits and vaults. The Town of Lewiston also removed and plugged a section of the 30-in outfall pipeline where it crosses the South West Drainage Ditch.
