The confirmation of prior disposal activity, during DOD ownership, on an area of the Occidental property adds to the concern that DOD waste disposal in the area has not been fully investigated. The LOOW Historical Aerial Photo Analysis, January 2003, Slide 24, records the presence of two buildings, opposite the fenced and gated disposal area, suggesting a degree of organization and planning on the part of DOD. Note, these buildings appeared during DOD ownership and were not present in 1942, but there is no record of the buildings being constructed as part of the LOOW.
