1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Introduction

The United States Army Corps of Engineers, Buffalo District (USACE) has designed this Community Relations Plan to facilitate communication with the Lewiston/Porter community in regard to the Niagara Falls Storage Site (NFSS) under the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP). This plan has been prepared as a guide for use during the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) phase at the site.

Federal regulations require that during the RI/FS federal agencies develop community relations programs to be consistent with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) and the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP). These requirements are the basis for more comprehensive and effective community relations activities.

This plan describes how the public will be involved in the RI/FS and decision-making process for Niagara Falls Storage Site. Included in this plan will be:

- Public Involvement Goals and Objectives
- FUSRAP Historical Information
- Site Location, Description, Ownership, and History
- Community Profile
- Community Relations Activities

The information in this plan is based on United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) guidance on community relations and ongoing interaction with community members.

1.2 Public Involvement Goals and Objectives

It is the goal of USACE to be honest, forthright, responsive, and clear in dealing with the public, elected officials, interest groups, and the media.

It is the objective of USACE to increase public awareness of the program and its activities, decrease misunderstanding about environmental problems and potential dangers, facilitate two-way communication with the affected public, establish an effective means for dispute resolution, and enhance USACE's ability to perform this mission in the most effective and efficient manner.

1.3 Phase of Site Remediation Addressed by this Community Relations Plan

The Niagara Falls Storage Site is currently under Remedial Investigation. USACE will hold meetings as new information becomes available to keep local officials and the Lewiston-Porter community informed.

1.4 Access to Information and Opportunities for Public Comment

Information about the Niagara Falls Storage Site can be found in the Administrative Record File in the Lewiston Public Library located at 305 South Eighth Street, Lewiston, New York, and the USACE FUSRAP Public Information Center located at 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, New York, 14207. The Administrative Record File contains historical documents and will be updated as new reports become available for the site.

2.0 FUSRAP HISTORICAL INFORMATION

In 1974 the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, initiated FUSRAP to identify and clean up or otherwise control sites where residual radioactivity remains in excess of current guidelines from work that supported the Manhattan Project. The Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act, 1998, authorized USACE to manage FUSRAP.

3.0 NIAGARA FALLS STORAGE SITE INFORMATION

3.1 Site Location, Description, History, and Ownership




Figure 1 Niagara Falls Storage Site and Surrounding Area

The Niagara Falls Storage Site is located at 1397 Pletcher Road in the Township of Lewiston (Niagara County) in northwestern New York, about 19 miles northwest of Buffalo, 10 miles north of the City of Niagara Falls (Figure 1). NFSS is located on part of the former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works, a site developed for producing explosives during World War II. In 1944, the NFSS portion of LOOW was used by the Manhattan Engineer District for storing radioactive residues and wastes from uranium ore processing conducted during the development of the atomic bomb. Until the late 1950's, additional radioactive residues and wastes were brought to the site for storage.

In 1982, the government began cleaning up contamination at the site and nearby areas. These initial efforts included construction of an earthen containment structure to effectively control the radioactive residues and wastes. During construction, the residues,

which are more radioactive than the wastes, were placed in the reinforced concrete foundation of a building within a portion of the waste containment structure. The radioactive soils and debris from the cleanup of the drainage ditches and other contaminated areas were then placed on top of the residues and in other areas of the structure.

The containment structure, completed in 1986, was built to control existing hazards for an interim period of up to 25 years. In 1986 the U.S. Department of Energy published an Environmental Impact Statement, which assessed and compared several alternatives for long-term waste management. In 1995, the National Academy of Science issued a report called "Safety of the High-Level Uranium Ore Residues at the Niagara Falls Storage Site, Lewiston, New York", that recommended removal, treatment, and disposal off-site of the NFSS high-level residues. USACE is evaluating the Environmental Impact Statement and the NAS report while developing alternatives for remediation of the site. These alternatives will be evaluated according to the CERCLA process. NFSS is currently United States Government property.

3.2 Type of Hazardous Substances at the Site

The K-65 residues contain the greatest concentration of radioactive material. The primary contaminants of concern in the residues are radium-226, thorium-230, and the decay products associated with these contaminants. USACE performs annual environmental monitoring at the site to evaluate the effectiveness of the Waste Containment Structure. Completed reports are available in the Administrative Record File for the site.

3.3 Nature of Threat and Potential Threat to Public Health, Welfare, and the **Environment**

Under current site conditions, no exposure hazard exists for workers or other members of the public from NFSS.

4.0 COMMUNITY PROFILE

4.1 Lewiston-Porter Community Demographics

The Niagara Falls Storage Site is located in the Town of Lewiston in Niagara County, New York. Town of Lewiston voters elect a supervisor every two years, and elect four town board members as legislators and town administrators for alternating four year terms. Residents direct their questions, complaints, and suggestions to the town clerk, who forwards them to the proper department or official.

The Niagara County government includes a county legislative chairperson that is appointed by the county legislators every year. The members of the county legislature are elected to a two-year term. The legislature is composed of 19 members.



4.2 Site Location in Relationship to Homes, Businesses, Lakes, Streams, Parks

The Town of Lewiston area is rural/residential with many agricultural areas. There is very little industry within the town. The current land use immediately to the north, east, and south of NFSS is waste disposal. The land to the immediate west of the site is currently vacant. There is a recreational campsite located southwest of the site, and the area west of the site on Pletcher Road is residential. The Lewiston-Porter School System buildings are located approximately 2.5 miles west of the site.

NFSS is located three miles east of the Niagara River and four miles south of Lake Ontario.

4.3 Areas of Special Sensitivity That Must be Considered during Community Relations and Remedial Investigation

The Lewiston-Porter community has expressed concern regarding the safety of long-term storage of the K-65 material in the waste containment structure at NFSS. They would like to be kept informed of any future work or plans for NFSS.

The community has expressed concern regarding the proximity of NFSS to the Lewiston-Porter school facilities. USACE has researched their concerns and has not found any evidence of MED contamination on school property.

4.4 Chronology of Community Involvement

USACE has held three information sessions with the community since the transfer of FUSRAP. These meetings were held January 1998, May 1998 and March 1999. Community concerns expressed at these meetings have been outlined in the previous section.
