Niagara opposes LOOW plan

TOWN OF NIAGARA — The Town
Board Tuesday offered support to Lewiston's efforts to block a proposal to develop a radioactive waste storage site at the former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works.

Board member Louis W. Bellreng made the motion, which opposed "any expansion of plans" by the federal Department of Energy to create a radioactive waste repository at the LOOW site.

The 191-acre site is on Pletcher Road.

Bellreng directed Town Clerk Lou Ann Murawski to send letters to the DOE;

John B. Daly, R-Lewiston; Rep. John J. LaFalce, D-Tonawanda; and U.S. Sens. Daniel Patrick Moynihan and Alfonse D'Amato.
