_ew-Port wants pay for contaminated site

YOUNGSTOWN - The Lewiston-Porter Board of Education wants compensation from the U.S. Department of Energy for the Niagara Falls Storage Site.

The board passed a resolution Tuesday that asks the Department of Energy for payment in lieu of taxes for the site, formerly the Lake Ontario Ordnance Works, which has been off the tax rolls for 45 years.

The 190-acre site on Pletcher Road contains 250,000 cubic yards of radioactive residues and wastes from the World War II Manhattan Project development of the atomic bomb.

The U.S. Department of Energy has decided the waste should remain at the site forev-
