The report documents the nature and extent of radiological and chemical contamination on the Niagara Falls Storage Site resulting from the nation's early nuclear program under the Manhattan Engineer District and Atomic Energy Commission.

The report also evaluates potential risks to human health and the environment from the findings. There are currently no imminent hazards to safety or health from radiological or chemical exposure within the Niagara Falls Storage Site or to a member of the public outside the site.

The Remedial Investigation Report was produced by the Corps under the authority of the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP). The Corps is the lead federal agency executing the FUSRAP.
