
This is in response to your letter dated October 6, 2000 in which you requested the Department's approval to use the following waste as Alternate Grading Material (AGM) at the Town of Tonawanda landfill:

Approximately 460 tons of non-hazardous petroleum contaminated soil available from the site of a former filling station in the City of Niagara Falls. Previous investigations determined that several underground storage tanks were removed from the property in the 1970s. NYSDEC spill case number 9875414 was assigned to the site. EnSol has submitted analytical data which confirms that the soil is non-hazardous.

Therefore, the Department hereby approves the above material to be used as AGM at the Town of Tonawanda landfill in accordance with the conditions and provisions previously approved regarding the placement, grading and control of the material. Also, should there be any objectionable odors generated from the petroleum contaminated soils, the Department may require that additional control measures be implemented at the landfill.
