## Trio charged with stealing sewer grates

Town of Tonawanda police have arrested three people in connection with the thefts of sewer grates from several town businesses.

John A. McDonald Sr., 52 of Eden; Edward Murphy 43, of Buffalo; and Frank Bogdan, 45, of Buffalo were each charged with one felony count of grand larceny and two misdemeanor counts of petit larceny.

The department reported that as scrap metal prices increase, the town and surrounding municipalities have been experiencing an increase in thefts of sewer grates.

These arrests came after a brief investigation by Detectives Timothy Connolly and Russell Paternostro.

Updated Baseline Risk Assessment for Landfill Operable Unit of Tonawanda Landfill Released and Availability Session to be Held

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District is announcing the release of the updated Baseline Risk Assessment for the Landfill Operable Unit of the Tonawanda Landfill Vicinity Property to the Linde Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) Site, located in the Town of Tonawanda, New York.

In 2009 through 2011 the Corps conducted additional soil, groundwater, sediment and surface water sampling on the Landfill Operable Unit of the vicinity property, to confirm the levels and extent of uranium, radium and thorium in the Landfill Operable Unit. Data from this sampling was used to update the Baseline Risk Assessment to ensure that it accurately reflects the potential for human exposure to FUSRAP-related material in the Landfill Operable Unit, given the Landfill's proximity to residential property.

Based on the analysis provided in the updated Baseline Risk Assessment, the Corps' next step will be to prepare a Feasibility Study for the Landfill Operable Unit. The Feasibility Study will develop remedial alternatives which would be appropriate to mitigate potential future unacceptable risks from exposure to the buried FUSRAP-related material in the Landfill Operable Unit.
