General Investigations

Location

- The study areas are located in Ashtabula, Lake, Geauga, Cuyahoga, Erie, Huron, Lucas, Sandusky, and Stark Counties in Ohio

Project Description

- A reconnaissance study would be conducted to determine if a Federal interest exists in flood risk management measures and offer recommendations to address the flooding risk in the counties listed

Importance

- Northeast OH experienced major flood events in 2006, resulting in a state of emergency being declared by OH Governor Ted Strickland for the affected counties. Numerous different watersheds associated with Lake Erie are involved

Consequences

- Without funding, the ability to document the flood risk damages and opportunities to develop flood risk management measures will remain unknown


