VILLAGE OF OTTAWA – OH Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration

Section 206 of the 1986 Water Resources Development Act of 1986, as amended
Construction General (Continuing Authorities Program)

Location

- Village of Ottawa is located in Putnam County, Ohio

Project Description

- The initial phase of the feasibility study will determine the Federal interest and potential ecosystem restoration measures
- Feasibility phase is cost-shared 50% Federal and 50% non-Federal
- Design and Implementation is cost-share 65% Federal and 35% non-Federal

Importance

- Located in an area historically within the Great Black Swamp of NW Ohio, restoration measures would seek to restore riparian wetlands as part of the Blanchard River Watershed, with benefits in wildlife habitat and water quality

Consequence

- Efforts would seek to complement parallel watershed level efforts by USDA-NRCS, USACE, and others in the Western Lake Erie Basin, which includes the Blanchard River Watershed


