Major Martin E. Lewton **Deputy District Commander**



MAJ Martin E. Lewton was born in Boise, Idaho, and entered active service in June 1996. He is currently the Deputy District Commander for the Buffalo District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. He has served in several leadership and staff positions throughout his military career. His first duty station was Fort Lewis, Washington, where he was a Sapper Platoon Leader and then Support Platoon Leader for Charlie Company, 14th Engineer Battalion (Corps) (Wheeled). He also served as an Assistant Operations Officer for the 14th Engineer Battalion. At his next assignment in 2001, he served as an Operations Officer for 2nd Engineer Battalion (Mechanized) at Camp Castle, Republic of Korea. From 2002 to 2005, he was assigned to the 84th Engineer Combat Battalion (Heavy) at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. He spent his first year there as the Battalion Adjutant and then took command of Bravo Company, 84th Engineer Battalion, just prior to the unit's deployment for Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF III).

After redeployment, he served for a short period as the Battalion Operations Officer (S3). From 2005 to 2007, he was assigned to 1-361st Engineer Training Support Battalion in Fort Carson, Colorado. While there he served as Observer Controller/Trainer Team Chief for Bravo Company, 1-361st Engineer Battalion (TS). Their area of coverage included support to Fort Riley, Kansas, Fort Bliss, Texas and Fort Irwin, California. After the Command and General Staff College, MAJ Lewton relocated to Fort Benning, Georgia in 2008 where he served as the Brigade Engineer for 3rd Heavy Brigade Combat Team (HBCT), 3rd Infantry Division. In 2009, MAJ Lewton took over as the Battalion Operations Officer (S3) for the Special Troops Battalion, 3rd HBCT, 3rd ID, for their deployment in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF VII). MAJ Lewton redeployed in August 2010 and joined the Buffalo District in September 2010.

MAJ Lewton's military education includes the Engineer Officer Basic Course, Engineer Officer Advanced Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School (CAS3) and the Command and General Staff College.

MAJ Lewton's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, the Meritorious Service Medal (third award), the Army Commendation Medal (fourth award), the Army Achievement Medal (fifth award), the National Defense Service Medal, the Iraqi Campaign Medal (with 3 Campaign stars), the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Korean Defense Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon and the Overseas Service Ribbon (with numeral 4).

MAJ Lewton is a 1996 graduate of Norwich University, Northfield, Vermont, where he received a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering. While at CGSC in 2008, MAJ Lewton earned a Master's Degree in Administration from Central Michigan University.
