Kent:
Congratulations! I understand things are well and you are tired. Just wait.
The bigger they get, the bigger the problems. But it is all part of the joy!

Anyways, a quick summary of what the current issues are includes:

- RAB - Our RAB Meeting went very well. The board asked for another meeting in a-months so we will have another meeting on September 20th. I will send the PowerPoint presentation from our July 12th meeting as a separate message.
- EE/CA - We plan to release for public comment our EE/CA for the Area C Trash Pit and Drum Area by the end of the month. The report looks good but you need to be aware that we are abandoning TAGM 4046 (soils) for EPA Region-5 PRGs. This is an evolution of the TAGM issues as not being promulgated or legally enforceable. It should not have a major impact on this interim removal action since it addresses backfill. We plan on developing site specific risk based criteria for the entire site during the feasibility.
- RI (Phase 2) - The fieldwork for the RI is underway by EA Engineering. There has been a significant overrun on the asbestos but we are addressing that. Soil sampling is underway and should proceed through the next couple of months. John Syms finally signed the right-of-entry so we plan on getting over there in a few weeks. The issue of the dead frogs and you taking some samples from the Syms property keeps coming up. Please send me any analytical data that you have or any information that may be of interest.

PIPELINES - The pipeline removal is starting. Severson has mobilized and is just doing surveying and clearing actions, We are hoping to start some excavations next week. All the workplans should be ready for distribution by the end of next week. I will provide you a copy when they are available.

We understand and plan to develop a clearer description of PRP issues and how it fits into your processes, investigate a couple of buildings left on Lewiston Township property, look at the remaining UST issues. These are on our list.

When things calm down and you get a chance to come out to this area, let me know.
