He is also a licensed Professional Engineer in the state of Missouri.

He participated in Operation Enduring Freedom first as a platoon leader and company executive officer. Following the Engineer Officer Captain's Career Course, he served as an assistant operations officer with the 6th Engineer Battalion (Airborne) at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson (JBER), Alaska. He subsequently commanded, 23rd Sapper Company (Airborne) at JBER, Alaska. His company command included a deployment to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

MAJ Billmann is a graduate of the Engineer Officer Basic and Captain Career Courses; the Army Command and General Staff College; and the Army Airborne, Ranger and Sapper Leader Schools.
