Hello from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Buffalo District:

The public meeting to present the proposed plan and preferred alternative for the Occidental Chemical Corporation Property (OCCP) portion of the LOOW will be conducted at the Town of Lewiston Senior Center, 4361 Lower River Road, Youngstown, New York 14171. The agenda for the meeting is as follows:

6:30 p.m. – Poster session

7:00 p.m. – Proposed plan and preferred alternative presentation

7:30 p.m. – Public comments recorded

A court recorder will be available to record your verbal comments after the presentation. Written comments may be provided that evening, e-mailed to derpfuds@usace.army.mil; or mailed to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Buffalo District, Attention: Environmental Project Management Team, 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, New York 14207. The comment period ends February 7, 2017.

The Corps of Engineers' preferred alternative outlined in the proposed plan is Alternative 4: Excavation and Off-Site Disposal, to address contaminated soils at Area of Concern (AOC) 1 of the OCCP. No further action is required by the Department of Defense for AOCs 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the OCCP.
