Site Inspection Report Ground Disturbances at the Former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works Formerly Used Defense Site

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District is pleased to announce the availability of the Site Inspection Report, Ground Disturbances at the Former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works, on the Buffalo District website in the Reports Section at <http://www.lrb.usace.army.mil/Missions/HTRW/DERPFUDS/LakeOntarioOrdnanceWorks.aspx>

The former Lake Ontario Ordnance Works (LOOW) is located in the towns of Lewiston and Porter, Niagara County, New York, and was used during World War II as a trinitrotoluene (TNT) manufacturing facility. To prepare the report, a preliminary assessment of ground disturbances identified from 1944 aerial photographs was performed and 20 ground disturbances were selected for walkover inspection. The report concludes that there is no evidence of potential contaminant source areas or releases of contamination to groundwater, surface water, or soil associated with any of the ground disturbances evaluated. No further action is necessary for the ground disturbances evaluated.

The report was prepared as part of the Corps' environmental response project conducted under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program for Formerly Used Defense Sites (DERPFUDS) in accordance with the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (42 U.S.C. § 9601 et. seq. as amended) and the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (40 CFR 300).
