

Luckey Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program Site News from the Corps
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Hello from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District:

The Corps of Engineers current remediation contract for the Luckey Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) Site is close to reaching its \$100 million dollar capacity. The Buffalo District has published a presolicitation notice for a new remediation contract at <https://beta.sam.gov/opp/92d8f22339d44be9af94221d771819b5/view> on the web. The notice enables potential bidders the opportunity to provide feedback, which will facilitate the solicitation process. Comments on the draft solicitation are due to the Buffalo District by March 5, 2020 at 3:00 PM EST.

The Corps of Engineers continues to make progress in cleaning up the Luckey Site. We have removed 49,357 cubic yards of soil with FUSRAP-related contamination from the site and are over 86% complete with Phase 1 of the project. Overall, the entire cleanup is 28% complete.

Our highest priority during cleanup activities at the Luckey Site is to be protective of human health and the environment, ensure that work is conducted in a safe and efficient manner, and prevent the spread of contamination.
