PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND:

- The primary objective of this project is to restore approximately 5,800 linear feet of the Cuyahoga River and reforestation of 30 acres within the surrounding floodplain, which are within the boundary of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP). The result will be an ecologically diverse stream and wetland system dominated by native vegetation and able to support a diverse community of native insects, amphibians, birds, and other wildlife. The restoration of the streambank will help reduce sediment runoff downstream and reforestation of the surrounding area will allow for the establishment of native vegetative species.
