PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND:

- Dredged material management plan is a planning document that identifies the quantity of material to be dredged from federal harbors and how the dredged material can be managed in an economically and environmentally acceptable manner. The Buffalo District has been collaborating with project partners, stakeholders, and is working to identify specific long-term placement sites for dredged material from Cleveland Harbor. This includes beneficial use of dredged material projects and different scenarios for open-lake placement.
